IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR THE YEAR: Homework: Homework will be sent home nightly. Homework should never take more than 15 minutes (not including minutes for reading). Homework will typically include a reading and math worksheet. If it begins to become a difficult task to complete at night please let me know. The purpose of homework is to reinforce the skills learned at school and to get students used to the routine of homework. Reading logs: Inside your child's homework folder there is a reading log. Please keep the reading log attached to the folder. Each night it is so important to read for at least 15 minutes. Please fill out the reading log each night with the books that you read. We will have a friendly competition in the classroom throughout the

Morning routine: It is so important that you come to school on time. Each morning we will have assembly in the auditorium. We will then begin the day promptly after that. A schedule has been sent home to everyone, you can see that our days are very structured, it is important not to be late so that the day will run smoothly.
